

METHODOLOGY

The survey was conducted with 1,501 Canadians, aged 15 to 30, from August 10 to 16, 2023. A random sample of panelists were invited to complete the survey from a set of partner panels based on the Lucid exchange platform. These partners are typically double opt-in survey panels, blended to manage out potential skews in the data from a single source.

The margin of error for a comparable probability-based random sample of the same size is +/- 2.53%, 19 times out of 20.

The data were weighted according to census data to ensure that the sample matched Canada's population according to age, gender, educational attainment, and region. Totals may not add up to 100 due to rounding.

The 2020 survey referenced throughout was conducted with 3,000 Canadians, aged 15 to 30, from December 2 to 14, 2020.



KEY FINDINGS

- Mining continues to be viewed less favourably among those under 35 compared with other sectors but there has been a slight increase in positive perceptions from 24% in 2020 to 27% today.
- There is a belief that mining has good pay and benefits (65%) and that there are lots of jobs available (58%) but only 26% think the work is safe.
- 34% would consider a career in the mining sector an increase of 3% compared to 2020. The perceived danger and physical demands are primary factors deterring from pursuing careers in the mining sector.
- 34% believe the sector is expanding and anticipate job growth over the next decade.
- The "We Need Mining, Mining Needs You" campaign video receives a favorable responses (60% positive), contributing to improved impressions of the mining industry. 65% had at least a somewhat more positive perception of the industry after watching the video.
- Young people generally believe there will be a need for a more skilled workforce in mining and that the industry is improving on the development of smart mines. There is some skepticism that the sector is becoming more environmentally sustainable (57% think it is believable) and 54% think it is believable that most jobs in the sector don't require workers to work in the mine.
- Pay, work-life balance, job security, and flexible schedules are key considerations for the 15-30 age group when choosing careers. Notably pay has become even more important since 2020. Nevertheless, the youngest generations seeks jobs that support both personal fulfillment and financial stability.




CURRENT CAREER AND CAREER PREFERENCES





Pay is the most important factor in career choice







Most would prefer indoor, site-based work with minimal travel




















Perceived danger and physical demand are top reasons for lack of interest in mining sector




Most perceive a career in mining as skilled, meaningful and respected work that is difficult to get into and is mostly for men







Perceptions of a career in mining among those with positive impression of mining



34% (+5 from 2020) believe jobs in the mining sector will increase in Canada





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

Positions that are non-operational are more likely to be considered









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Those who liked the video found it informative and a positive reflection of the mining sector








